



# Part Time Drinkaware Crew Member (3 positions available)

Reporting to: Union Venues and Events Manager and the affiliated night Venues Managers

Are you outgoing, confident and motivated to play an important part in keeping the atmosphere on a night out friendly and respectful, and to support people who may be vulnerable?

The Union of Students in conjunction with Drinkaware are looking to train and provide Drinkaware Crew for our student affiliated club nights to improve our ability to look after our guests on a night out and, to identify and support people who may be vulnerable due to drinking too much. Working with a partner, you will mingle with guests, take opportunities to promote positive behaviour, and help guests in practical ways. You will work with security, management and bar staff to escalate issues if required, and will complete an activity log at the end of the shift.

Please note: we are looking at students to recruit successful candidates to be in place for the start of the new Academic Year 2019/20. The final term of this academic year will cover necessary training required for this role ready for September 2019.

#### JOB DESCRIPTION FOR DRINKAWARE CREW:

## Main Purpose of Role:

This role is offered in collaboration with Drinkaware, the charity which aims to reduce alcohol related harm by helping people make better choices about their drinking.

#### **About Drinkaware Crew:**

Drinkaware Crew is part of Drinkware's Drunken Nights Out programme, developed to reduce alcohol related harm amongst 18 – 24 year olds who participate in drunken nights out. Drinkaware Crew are a dedicated resource within a large club or venue responsible for helping maintain an enjoyable and safe environment for customers.

They do this by focusing on two goals:

- 1. Promoting and encouraging a positive social atmosphere.
- Providing support for customers who are already experiencing certain kinds of distress or trouble. This might include helping customers who have lost their friends or are unsure of how they're getting home, or simply providing emotional support.

This is achieved as follows through the different stages of the evening:

- At the start of the evening they will introduce themselves to people in the queue or entrance, setting an expectation of a bar where drunken behaviour is not acceptable and raise awareness of the fact they are there to help.
- In the middle of the evening they will spend more time inside the venue to identify potentially vulnerable customers, for example checking toilets and proactively offering support.
- At the end of the night the emphasis will be on protecting vulnerable people, for example ensuring they get safely into registered taxis. Crew should stay on duty until half an hour after the venue has closed.

Drinkaware Crew always work in pairs to offer support and assistance to customers while ensuring they don't become vulnerable. Previous experience working in the night time economy or with the target age group would be an advantage.

# What will I be doing?

- Introducing yourself to guests as they arrive for the night and explaining your role in helping to ensure that the club can look after its customers on a night out.
- Walking around the club, mingling with guests and reminding them you are there if needed.
- Working in partnership with bar staff, managers and security to promote safety.
- Notifying security staff when the risk of harm or violence escalates.
- Offering care and kindness to vulnerable people or those in distress, and where appropriate signposting them to appropriate professional help and services.
- Providing practical support to females who are vulnerable, potentially vulnerable or at risk of sexual harassment/unwanted behaviour.

- Providing practical support (tissues/water/first aid) to those who have drunk too much alcohol
- Helping vulnerable guests at the end of the night to get home safely by reuniting them with their friends or finding them a licenced cab.
- Feeding into the Drinkaware Crew evaluation process, including completing incident logs at the end of the shift.

# Key skills and experience:

- In tune with the culture, interests and trends of our typical guests 18-24 year olds.
- Socially confident, able to chat and mingle with guests and be assertive enough to encourage positive behaviour.
- Open-minded and non-judgemental with good listening skills to support vulnerable or distressed guests, or those who have over-consumed alcohol.
- Pro- active and able to work on your own initiative and with other staff in a busy club environment.
- Resilient enough to cope with direct and challenging verbal comments and keep calm in challenging situations.
- The ability to stay calm in stressful circumstances.
- Previous experience working with the age group 18-24 or working in the night time economy would be beneficial, but not required.

# **Training:**

- Full training will be provided to prepare Drinkaware Crew for this role. Drinkaware Crew must have completed training and successfully passed the assessment before they will be permitted to start.
- Following the training you will receive Drinkware Crew uniform (t-shirt, hoodie, jacket) and the Drinkaware Crew kit
