

We strive to provide life changing opportunities for our students to stand out from the crowd through high quality development experiences, big and small.

This year that led to a record-breaking 1,214 students taking part in a 'Give it a Go' sport or society activity – trying something new for the very first time.



150 clubs and societies were supported this year, and it's the committees involved behind the scenes that are the lifeblood of these opportunities. It's thanks to them that over 2,500 students at the University can regularly participate in their chosen activity.

We support and develop these students, empowering them to be the best that they can be, developing their skill set and helping them understand how it can be transferred into the work place after graduation.



323 students undertook Sport and Society Leadership Training as part of the committee development programme, with **82% agreeing that they are more employable as a result of the training.**

Our committees use these skills throughout the year to implement their club development plans to track and manage improvements and growth within their groups. This year we celebrated their success by awarding Bronze, Silver, or Gold status according to their progress.

This year we have also seen huge success in the increase in the number of Union Futures Awards; 95 students completed the award representing a 15% increase on previous years!

The Futures Award recognises the skills developed by being part of Union opportunities such as; being a committee member, a Programme Rep or a Part Time Officer.



The Union also offers employment to student staff, where alongside a supportive working environment we also offer a competitive wage and additional development opportunities:

5,408 student staff hours were offered across three Union shops, providing students with employment as well as making them more employable after leaving us with 12 first aid trained, eight mental health first aid trained, and over 40 food safety certified.

Activities & Events!

This academic year we attended 28 events across the Fresher's fortnight including the international students feast, welcome BBQ at high peak halls and the welcome breakfast across Derby halls of residence. We also hosted the big RAG (raise and give) quiz of the year at the academy which saw a turnout of over 100 students and raised £177 for local charities. It would be an understatement to say we were tired after those two weeks, but it was an incredible opportunity to meet hundreds of new students and welcome them to Derby!

Through working with the University and external providers, we delivered a series of student trips during the year. Our UK trips took students to Liverpool, Chatsworth House and Bletchley Park. We also ran a trip to London which allowed students to participate in the Peoples Vote march and ignite their inner activist. 343 students embarked on the international trips we ran with Outgoing, a student tour company, to Amsterdam, Disney Land, Berlin and Croatia!

Christmas rapidly came around and we hit the road to wish our students at Buxton and Chesterfield a lovely break. We attended the Buxton Christmas party to support the event management students and visited the Chesterfield Christmas fair.



A new year began and so did our next series of events!


We hosted a sport and society fair so clubs had the opportunity to recruit new members. There was also a tour around BBC radio Derby for our Student Radio volunteers. The Officers headed over to Northampton to support our societies taking part in varsity. We even filled in for absent students by taking part and winning the debate!

We held a pop up stand in the atrium on Valentine's Day to encourage self-love and distributed well-earned sweets. In March we celebrated International Women's Day by hosting a women in leadership conference which attracted students from foundation year to post graduates. They took part in self-defence, lush bath bomb making and heard some incredible speakers!



Here's what else we got up to:

- 80 students planted seeds over freshers and the volunteering fair which we've planted at our allotment
- We hosted a quiz as part of the Get Ahead programme welcoming students on campus early who have selected abilities
- We opened for applications for the University of Derby's first ever University Challenge Team
- We hosted the Unions first ever Student Led Services Conference which brought together our students involved in student media, fundraising and volunteering to learn new skills
- We helped out on the clearing hotline accepting new students into the University

As an Officer team we have worked hard from the start of our year to the end to be active contributors to charities and our local community. Through the events and fundraising we've undertaken, the officer team have contributed £3,465 towards the RAG total which is amazing. We have dressed up, slept out and climbed a mountain all in the name of charity!

We've also taken our responsibility as members of the Derby community seriously by representing students at local residents meetings, creating links with local organisations such as the Derby Telegraph and visiting schools and colleges across Derbyshire and Nottinghamshire to promote the benefits of higher education.

Other non-quantifiable charitable action includes donating the old playing kit to the Lord Taverners charity who distribute it to those in need around the world, and packing and wrapping shoe boxes as part of the shoe box appeal.

Facilities & Services

Services and facilities have dominated student voice forums and the online ideas forum all year so we have worked with the estates department to bring you the changes you want!



It was really important to us that students had the option to heat their own food on campus. By installing five new microwaves students at all sites now have access to hot food which is great for late night studying and saving money!

The new microwaves are at:

- Markeaton Street
- Britannia Mill
- Chesterfield
- Derby Theatre
- One Friar Gate Square

Staying hydrated is equally important so we worked with the University to provide 8 new water fountains across 5 sites!

- Kedleston Road
- Markeaton Street
- Derby Theatre
- The STEM building





We also listened to your feedback on transport...

We collected all of your feedback on car parking and the bus service and presented it to the University. They will be using this to make improvements to the service next year! We also asked the 24hr library bus to be added to the Rygo app so you know where it is during the night.

We went out talking to students to ask them what they want to see in the Union spaces, over 100 to be precise! It was great to hear what more you want on campus and we will be taking that forward as part of the new estates strategy. We will also be introducing a new loyalty scheme for our Union shops, bar and coffee shops so students can save as they spend. Finally, we lobbied the University for longer opening hours at other sites which was successful too.

Have an opinion

Have an opinion is a campaign we delivered this year in partnership with the University. We're really passionate about student voice which is why we created this campaign which encourages students to have an opinion on a number of topics!

We held three debates on the following subjects:

- Commercialised Christmas
- How does the university spend my money?

We've also been asking big questions on our social media account as well as placing opinion boards around sites for student to write on.

The campaign engaged over 3000 students and will be back next year!


We also acknowledge the amazing work our reps do which is why we wanted to hold events for us to get together. We met over 80 reps at socials and the leadership retreat. We also hosted a mixer event for reps to meet the Deans and senior staff members in their colleges!



24 Hour Library!

The student population has been asking for 24 hour access to the library for years and this year we got it!

After years of campaigning the University opened the library doors for 24 hours for two busy assessment times over the year. We've worked closely with the University to get the message out about it, which included walking through the atrium holding signs! We've also been gathering your feedback on the 24 hour opening and this will be used to improve the service next year!



Equality, Diversity & Inclusion

Although we've put equality, diversity and inclusion in its own category, it has been very much embedded in all of the officers' activity this year.

We've delivered campaigns for celebratory history months such as LGBTQ+ and Black history. Over 60 students attended the colour dash which raised over £400 for student minds and was so much fun!

We also listened to your feedback on EDI matters all year through the elected student committee and the wellbeing advisory group which has fed into lots of things including an improved and more confidential waiting area.

We've made sure this year that our sports are trained to be the most inclusive they've ever been!

148 committee members attended the equality and diversity sessions which covered the following topics:

- Consent and sexual harassment
- LGBTQ+ in sport
- Disability in sport
- Mental Health in sport
- Eating Disorder support

More ways we supported you...

We co-delivered a student retreat focused on academic writing skills and student attainment

We made condoms, lubes and dams available free for all students regardless of age

We received mental health first aid training so we could support you better

We took students to a mental health conference so they could feed into the national student minds mental health charter

We worked with estates to offer free personal alarms and reflective items so students feel safe on their commute



Destresstival

This year we worked closely with the Union Advice team to deliver the biggest and best Destresstival yet! Our Destresstival event spanned across a whole week in Derby and Buxton which included sensory play, a visit from the guide dogs and a Buxton bake off. The aim of the event was to offer students a way to relax during exam and assessment times and make them aware of the support they can get from the Union if they need it.

Women in Leadership



The officers worked together to host a conference celebrating International Women's Day. The event was held in the multi faith centre and students from year 0 through to post graduate level attended. We welcomed fantastic externals from Lush, Rolls Royce and MCS defence academy.

The attendees participated in assertiveness and interview skills workshops, tried martial arts and yoga and even got to make their own bath bomb. The event was a huge success and engaged students we'd not seen in the Union before and ticket sales raised over £200 for local charity Women's Work.

Officer Impact Report 2018/19

Governance & Policy

2688 students
consulted on governance and policy

The officers represented Derby at the National Union of Students Annual Conference where we voted on national policy. We discussed things such as discounted rail travel for all students regardless of age, transgender campaigning and a complete reform of the NUS just to name a few.

We've also worked hard to look at the Union's policies and have been involved in creating a zero tolerance policy which says no to racism, homophobia and all forms of discrimination within our Union. We've also introduced two new part time officer positions within our structure to represent mature and commuter students.

Finally, as a team we worked on a complete restructure of the Officer Trustee team by reviewing all of our roles and making us the most representative we can be. This means next year we will have four officers instead of five with increased staff support and strong focuses for the future!

Over 2000 students had their say on anonymous marking

We conducted cross campus consultations for students and staff to give their opinion on anonymous marking. Over 2500 people in total fed into the making of the policy and it was approved by the University meaning it will be implemented in September 2019. Students said anonymous marking made them feel more confident and believed it was the fairest way.

Lobbying for a late submission policy with students in mind

We've worked hard looking at other universities policies on late submission and found our policy was particularly tough on students, considering anything submitted after the deadline, even by a minute, is a non-submission. This means students have to do a new piece of work and can only achieve 40%. We're proposing this changes to a reduction in grade each day it's late up to a week or that students can submit after the deadline and don't have to do the work again, their grade is just capped at 40.

Listening to transgender student voices

This year we created a transgender student advisory group to listen to their experiences. This group has been advising us on how we can improve their time at University and their feedback has been collated to create a transgender student policy which we are working with the University on.

Anonymous marking is back! A Christmas gift to you, from your Union. Your Union President has successfully lobbied the University to re-introduce anonymous marking starting in the academic year 2019/20

All summative assessment, where practical, will be marked anonymously, this means when submitting assignments you don't put your name on it, you put your student number instead!

This year we had Officer Facebook accounts for the first time which have been a huge success. We have been able to regularly update our membership on our day to day activity as well as polling for student opinion and advertising student opportunities!

We've also worked with marketing to create some video content such as our Christmas video (we're still sorry) and the international women's day video to cheer up students and empower them! Our weekly radio shows on Phantom Radio has seen us compete in silly games, miming the news and giving further regular updates. We hope through our various channels, we've been able to keep the student body up to date and involved in everything we do!

Through the Union's governance structure, we are truly led by students and want to make sure all voices are heard. We believe that everyone should be able to contribute meaningfully to their learning environment and be represented effectively.

Our full time Officer Trustees are the top of the structure and have been working hard all year to listen, campaign, lobby and effect change that you want to see - you can read about what they have been up to in the Officer Impact Report (in the centre of this document).



Sitting just below the full time officers, and aligned to each College, student interest, and liberation area are the **30 Part Time Officers**. Throughout the year, the Part Time Officers have been collating feedback from Programme Reps, delivering liberation campaigns and messages, and amplifying the voice of our students.

We also hosted **six student forums** throughout the year to promote the student voice and collate feedback; a central Panel Debate as part of the Programme Rep Conference, followed by forums targeting the lowest NSS-scoring programmes




We're shouting about our wins; 43 articles on the student voice have been posted on Union website and promoted through our social media platforms, recognising the hard work of our student representatives.

Keep your eye out for the Union's Rep Wins Report that details everything our Reps achieved this year.



We keep ourselves in check too; six Scrutiny Panels were hosted throughout this year, allowing students to question the Officer Trustees on their manifesto progress to date (read more about this in the Officer Impact Report).

We also held our Annual General Meeting; the forum to hear about and scrutinise the Union's work. Over 50 students attended this year with a further 594 viewing online.



This year an item was passed at the AGM, via the votes of our members, reducing the number of Officer Trustees from five to four, on the basis that the support for our Student-Led Services needed to be more operational than representative.



The Union Advice team have been providing a helping hand throughout the year; Offering over 50 drop-in Advice clinics across our Markeaton Street, Britannia Mill, One Friar Gate Square, Buxton, and Leek sites.

50



Over 500 student cases have been opened this year, ranging from academic issues to housing, and finance, with over 1,000 hours of case work spent face-to-face with students supporting them when they need it.



The Advice team have also delivered 46 different engagement events, around relevant topics. We've had Housing Fairs, De-stressfest, exam handouts, sexual health and Love Your Mind.

This has led to the team engaging with and having conversations with 2,545 students!

A bi-monthly Advice newsletter has been created and distributed online and physically around campus, sharing news, updates and tips around frequently asked questions of the advice service.



The Union also has a new Equality, Diversity and Inclusivity Strategy being embedded across all that we do, with each team having a lead member of staff to continue embedding good practice throughout the organisation.



eg there's been a significant decrease in the number of pints sold, reflecting the national social shift in student life away from a drinking culture, from 18,410 (2017/18) to 14,108 (2018/19) so we offered more non-drinking events:






We trained 128 Welcome Heroes across our Freshers' activities, to greet and assist new students while informing them about what the Union has to offer.
